WE ASK THAT WHEN ON THE TRAIL TO STAY ON THE MARKED TRAIL, DO NOT GO OFF. THE LANDOWNERS GRACIOUSLY DONATE THE MARKED AREA FOR THE TRAIL. BY GOING OFF THE MARKED TRAIL UPSETS THE LANDOWNER AND COULD BE THE CAUSE FOR LOSING PERMISSION OF THE TRAIL. THIS HAPPENS EVERY YEAR SOME WHERE AND TRAILS ARE LOST.BE A CONSCIENTIOUS SNOWMOBILER AND STAY ON THE TRAIL.

DON'T LET FREELoadERS STEAL YOUR TRAILS!

Permit revenues fund OFSC snowmobile trails. Every trail rider who does not buy a permit threatens your trail system. If enough freeloaders choose to ride without paying, here are five immediate consequences from lack of funding:

1. Clubs could not groom trails as often.
2. Your riding season could be shortened as groomers run out of fuel.
3. You could have fewer loops and connecting trails to ride.
4. Your trail access to services could be reduced or terminated.
5. Many remote and wilderness trails could be closed.

New Polaris Side-by-Side

This year the Rideau Snowmobile Club has decided to purchase a 2015 Polaris Side-by-Side from Crossings Road and Trail in Prescott. This machine will be used to assist with many volunteer tasks such as signing, trail cleanup and maintenance, trail inspections and more. As in previous years the club relied on our volunteer's machinery this is an excellent new resource for our club.
